



Human Anatomy and Physiology Prerequisite Requirement:

Human Anatomy and Human Physiology prerequisite requirements may be met by taking one of the following series:

- In a combined format by completing Human Anatomy and Physiology 1 & 2 (total of 6 semester units or 8 quarter units)
- OR:**
- Separate lecture courses for Human Anatomy and Human Physiology (each 3 semester units or 4 quarter units)

The important point is that these courses must be completed as a series, meaning that, for example, taking Human A&P 1 along with a Human Physiology lecture, though it does complete the semester/quarter units requirement, is not acceptable because it does not complete the series.

If you have only completed one quarter or one semester of a combined Human Anatomy and Physiology course and cannot return to the same institution to complete the series, you are advised to start over by taking the entire series. If you are faced with the choice of taking the individual courses at another institution, then you will need to take both courses just like you'd never begun the series.

Both courses must be at a level suitable for a pre-med or health science major.

Animal or vertebrate physiology is acceptable as a substitute for the human physiology course.

Animal or vertebrate anatomy may be an acceptable substitute for human anatomy as long as it is specifically stated in the course description that human anatomy is covered.

Comparative anatomy is NOT an acceptable substitute for human anatomy.
